

## Written Permission

Our company policy is to always have written permission before we go onto someone's property, there are several reasons for this.

- In order for Kathy to do an estimate on a tree, even just to prune the branches from your side, she will need to walk around the whole tree and assess its health. You have a legal right to prune branches from your neighbor's trees that grow into your yard provided you don't damage the health of the tree, we need to assess the health of each tree we prune. this requires a 360 degree visual inspection of the base of the tree.
- We pride ourselves on providing an excellent clean up after the work is finished. Our crew will sometimes need to access the neighbor's yard in order to do a thorough clean up (which is trespassing unless permission has been granted to do so).
- Our crew may need to climb the neighbor's tree in order to do the pruning on your side, and we don't put our employees safety on the line by agreeing to prune trees we have not thoroughly inspected. Even if we can see much of the trunk from the street or your property, there could be a decay cavity or crack or evidence of fungus on the hidden portion of the lower trunk that makes climbing it potentially hazardous.
